Kah-Nee-Ta resort to reopen in 2023

Kah-Nee-Ta was once a thriving resort and tourist destination in Warm Springs. The resort featured an Olympic size swimming pool, lodge, spa, restaurants, golf course, and RV park. Living out most of its peak season in the summertime, adored by families for decades, quickly becoming an annual vacation destination for those near and far. Those days all came to a screeching halt in 2018 when the resort sadly shuttered its doors for good. Or so we thought.

The Confederate Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon (CTWS) Tribal Council, approved funding of 4.58 million dollars to reopen the resort. The Kah-Nee-Ta resort is also partnering with Mt. Hood Skibowl to help develop and manage the project with a planned opening for later this year. It is estimated that the reopening will create 50 full time, and over 80 part time positions during the 6 month busy season. Additionally supporting over 15 full time jobs, and more than 20 part time jobs throughout the year. Reopening is also projected to boost local economy in neighboring areas of Madras and other areas of Central Oregon.

Slow Cooker Corned Beef & Cabbage with BEER!

Ingredients:

3lb Corned Beef Brisket

- 1 onion
- 4 Yukon gold potatoes
- 1 small head of cabbage
- 2 cups of baby or chopped carrots
- 1 bay leaf
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1 12oz beer



Place the carrots, quartered potatoes, and chopped onions in the bottom of a slower cooker. Cut the brisket in half and place on top of the veggies with chopped cabbage, pepper and spice packet that comes with the brisket. Pour the beer over the meat and veggies, and then fill the empty beer bottle with water twice and add that in as well until the mixture is mostly covered in liquid. As the ingredients cook, they will shrink and be more submerged. Place one bay leaf on the top. Turn the slow cooker on low, and cook for 8-9 hours or until the meat and veggies are tender. Or turn on high and cook half the time. Remove the bay leaf before eating. I like to dip mine in mustard. Enjoy!

Check Your Own Oil: Make Sure You're Doing It The Right Way

Here are the steps to follow to check your car's oil: 1. Check the oil when the engine is warm. Oil expands when it's hot and contracts when it's cold; different temperatures will give you different readings. Park the car on a level surface. 2. Turn off the engine. It's best to wait at least 10 minutes to give the oil a chance to drain down into the crankcase. Otherwise, you might think you're as much as a quart low when you're not. 3. Open your hood. 4. Find the dipstick - a long piece of metal sticking out of the engine usually located near the spark plugs with a loop at one end. Many dipsticks now have a "T" handle or are incorporated into the fill cap. If you don't find the loop, look for these. 5. Pull on the loop and draw the dipstick all the way out. 6. Wipe the oil off the dipstick with a paper towel or shop rag. 7. Replace the clean dipstick, making sure to push it all the way in; then pull it back out and hold it horizontally in front of you. 8. Look at the pointed end of the dipstick. If the oil on the dipstick is below the line marked "full", add a small amount of oil (less than a guarter of a guart) with a funnel. Many dipsticks simply have two lines with a cross hatch design in between. The oil level should be halfway between these two lines. 9. Add oil by unscrewing the oil filler cap, which is about 3 inches in diameter and is located on the very top of the engine. **10.** Check the oil level with the dipstick after adding oil. Add more if necessary. It's easy to add more oil but difficult to remove oil if you add too much so add slowly and continue rechecking. 11. Put the oil filler cap back on and secure it tightly. The oil lubricating system is a closed system. This means that the oil does not get "used up" or go anywhere. If it's consistently low, there may be an oil leak. Leaks always get worse, and losing all the engine oil will require expensive repairs and/ or replacing the engine. Make sure to bring it in if your car seems to have an oil leak.

For Portland souvenirs: Closed Loop Woodworks' Oregonshaped cutting boards made from reclaimed wood, silverware art by Spoonman Creations, twee illustrations from A Little Sun, and Love from the Hood apparel and greeting cards from ARTJADEN. For fine jewelry and wares: delicate metaland-gemstone jewelry handcrafted with guitar string from Bluce Designs, gorgeous stone settings in silver by Forest Lily Designs, and Queen of Cup, crafting bowls and cups in clay and porcelain. 
