Does Gasoline Freeze?

Temperature changes are on the horizon and gasoline is essential for transportation. But did you know it can actually freeze just like other liquids?

Gasoline is a mixture of chemicals. It doesn't have a so-called freezing point but it does have a freezing range.

As temperatures descend, gasoline gradually changes. At first, little bits of sediments and gums come out of the liquid. Fortunately, the filter located in the fuel line can actually catch the sediments in the gas tank and refineries can actually tweak gasoline mixtures to provide special blends for cold climate areas.

However when it gets extremely cold, the heaviest hydrocarbon molecules slowly solidify. They look waxy. When the temperature gets so unbearable, the gasoline becomes much waxier and slushier.

Things only get worse if gasoline becomes extremely waxy. By this stage, you're looking at temperatures around minus 40 degrees Fahrenheit. When water and water vapor freezes inside an automobile, they block gas in the fuel line. Some of the symptoms you want to watch out for:

- 1. The car starts to stall or sputter
- 2. The vehicle fails to start or turn over

To avoid the hassle of thawing a frozen fuel line, prevention is key! Keep the tank full and add antifreeze treatment.

Now we might not be looking at minus 40 degree weather but it's important to be prepared for the colder, unpredictable winter months. So to avoid any headaches or unexpected issues, do your due diligence and be ready for what mother nature throws your way.

Spiderweb Brownies

A fun and attractive entertaining treat to serve when you're looking for a dessert with a distinctive flair!

Ingredients

- 1 cup butter
- 3/4 cup cocoa powder
- 4 large eggs
- 2 cups sugar
- 3 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 1/2 cups all purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/3 cup white chocolate chips, melted

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Line 9x13 inch pan with foil and spray with cooking spray.
- 2. In medium sauce pan, melt butter. Once completely melted, remove from heat and stir in cocoa powder; set aside.
- 3. In large bowl, cream together eggs, sugar and vegetable oil until light and foamy. Add chocolate mixture and vanilla and stir until smooth.
- 4. In medium bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder and salt. Add dry ingredients to wet ingredients and stir until combined. Pour mixture into prepared pan.
- 5. Bake for 25-30 minutes until toothpick inserted into center comes out clean. Allow to cool completely before cutting into squares.
- 6. For the decorative icing, fill a small re-sealable bag with melted white chocolate. Cut off one corner and pipe chocolate onto brownies in shape of spider webs. Serve immediately, or store in a single layer in an airtight container.
